What to Expect when Scheduling Cataract Surgery

Helpful Information about Scheduling Surgery:

- You will need a preoperative physical.
- If you take blood thinners such as Coumadin, Warfarin or Jantoven, you will need a blood test prior to surgery.
- Two postoperative appointments (for each eye) will be scheduled today.
- If you are scheduling cataract surgery for both eyes, the surgeries are usually scheduled two weeks apart.
- You are given the option of selecting a surgery date today. You will receive a confirmed arrival time 1-2 weeks prior to surgery.
- You will need a driver for the day of surgery and for the first postoperative appointment. You may need a driver for other follow-up visits depending on your individual needs.
- You will take eye drops, as directed, before and after surgery.
